**Year of Founding:** 1884

**Location:** 1075 New Scotland Road in Albany, New York. AHN is within easy access of I-90 and I-85 and within walking distance of CDTA buses.

**Facilities:** Holy Names is located on a 64-acre suburban campus. Facilities include an Arts Center, Dance Studio, Broadcast Studio, Innovation Lab, Library, Science Labs, Math Lab, Learning Workshop, Gymnasium, the Margaret Hoffman Riley Auditorium, Student Commons, and Chapel, as well as playing fields, tennis courts, and a cross-country course.

**Grade Levels:** Grades 6 through 12.

**Enrollment:** Approximately 230 students from throughout the tri-city area. Students attend from Albany, Rensselaer, Schenectady, Saratoga, Columbia, and Schoharie counties.

**Transportation:** City of Albany residents receive bus passes for transportation on CDTA buses. Outlying school districts within a 15-mile radius provide transportation at no cost to AHN students. Students from Clifton Park/Saratoga can take advantage of private transportation at an additional cost.
